The Portland Plan is a long-range plan to make Portland a thriving and sustainable city — a city that is prosperous, healthy and rich in opportunity for all. Through it, Portlanders can help define community priorities, guide investments and set the course for the city and partner agencies for the next 25 years.

Based on priorities expressed through hundreds of community conversations and events, Portlanders said that living wage jobs, student success and a healthy environment are top priorities. In response to this feedback, extensive research and national best practices, an Equity Initiative and three draft strategies were developed:

1. Education;
2. Economic Prosperity & Affordability; and
3. Healthy Connected Neighborhoods.

These drafts are now available for public review.

This is one of the last opportunities to weigh in on these big ideas for Portland's future. A draft plan will be published this summer!
