Heritage Trees of Portland

SUGAR MAPLE (Acer saccharum) SAPINDACEAE

- Native to eastern North America (Canada to Texas). Source of maple sugar.
- Can reach over 100' but is usually less.
- Leaves are 5-lobed. It is on the flag of Canada.
- Winged seeds are U-shaped. Seed part is plump.
- Bark of mature trees is in shaggy plates.
- Fall color is scarlet, orange, yellow.
- Uncommon in city and some of Portland's trees do not achieve high fall color.
