



Heritage Trees of Portland

PACIFIC DOGWOOD (*Cornus nuttallii*) CORNACEAE

- Native to coastal B.C., western Washington and Oregon to Sierra Nevada.
- Height can reach 100' but is usually less.
- Leaf has smooth margins with a relatively few unbranching veins.
- Flowers inconspicuous but surrounding white bracts (4-7) look like petals. Bloom can occur in mid-spring and again in late summer. Fruit is an orange/scarlet "berry."
- Susceptible to a disease called anthracnose, which can kill tree limb by limb.
- Fairly common in Portland but disappearing from disease. #117 is largest in city.
