Heritage Trees of Portland

AMERICAN SYCAMORE (Platanus occidentalis) PLATANACEAE

- Native from central to eastern U.S.
- Height can reach 175', circumference 30'; most massive tree east of the Rockies.
- Leaves maple-like, up to 14" wide, 3 slightly indented lobes, shiny above and hairy below.
- Fruit balls solitary, persist into winter.
- Bark brown, breaking off into plate-like scales.
- Uncommon in Portland.
