



Heritage Trees of Portland

CHERRY (*Prunus avium*) ROSACEAE

- The wild sweet cherry, origin of today's eating cherries, is native to Eurasia.
- Height can reach 100'.
- Leaves are toothed.
- Flowers white with 5 petals, in clusters. Fruit depends on cultivar; species bright red turning almost black.
- Fall color varies from yellow to orange and red.
- Common in Portland. #206 is a Royal Ann cultivar; #211 dates from 1905.
