## **Heritage Trees of Portland**

PIN OAK (Quercus palustris) FAGACEAE

- Native to central and eastern U.S.
- Height seldom exceeds 125', usually less.
- Leaves 3-4 pointy lobes, rather small, thin and glossy; can persist through winter.
- Acorns tiny (1/2") and striated with shallow cup.
- Fall foliage variable bronze to red.
- A non-massive tree in all aspects.
- Common in Portland (palustris means "swamp").
