
## **Heritage Trees of Portland**

ENGLISH ELM (Ulmus minor var. vulgaris) ULMACEAE

- Native from England to central and south Europe.
- Height can exceed 125'.
- Leaves relatively small, 2-4" long, rough above and fuzzy beneath, especially in vein axils, base uneven.
- Flowers small, seed winged and nearly circular.
- Tree can have profuse suckering at base and lower trunk, lower branches can be corky.
- #36 was planted in the late 19th century. It was the only elm left standing on the north side of that block on Flanders after the Columbus Day storm of 1962.
