



102ND AVENUE – NE GLISAN TO SE WASHINGTON – BOULEVARD IMPROVEMENTS

The City of Portland is requesting \$3,000,000 for the second phase of a project to revitalize and transform a key arterial street into an urban boulevard, providing a framework for future redevelopment.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The redevelopment of 102nd Avenue, the spine of the Gateway District, into a boulevard was identified by the community and mentioned as a key transportation infrastructure improvement in the East Portland Action Plan and the 1999 Gateway Regional Center Plan.

This project will provide widened sidewalks, pedestrian scale lighting, street trees and medians that provide for pedestrian crossing opportunities. Existing on-street parking, which is not heavily used, will be removed to provide room for bike lanes.

This project also received \$2,000,000 in MTIP regional flexible federal funds.

These improvements will greatly increase and improve access to this area for consumers, pedestrians, and bicyclists, which will provide a significant economic benefit to the region and in an economically depressed area of East Portland.

PROJECT BENEFITS

- Provides new bicycle connections on key transit corridor to a major transit center
- Enhances pedestrian connections to major commercial centers and community facilities
- Installs new pedestrian lighting and installs new signals at high accident intersection
- Effectively manages stormwater and provides street trees
- Creates or maintains 64 jobs during construction
