

## New stores pop up around Portland

After months of planning, two temporary stores offering a range of potential gifts made by local artists and designers will open in downtown Portland.

Grand opening celebrations will be held at the stores tomorrow at 5 p.m.:

Flurry, a pop-up featuring clothing, shoes and accessories, will be located at 401 S.W. Morrison, across from Pioneer Place in the former Shoe Pavillion store (and before that, the Nordstrom Rack). Local labels at Flurry include Betty Jean Couture, DefYance, Isaac Hers, La Merde and O'Pearl Jewelry

**Workroom 719**, located across from Nordstrom in the old See's Candy store, will feature clothing, jewelry, prints and some on-site, working artists. Workroom artists include Abra Ancliffe, printmaker; Scarlet Chamberlin, jewelry designer; Jayson Wynkoop, printmaker and Rachel Ancliffe, who will be designing and sewing fashions in the space.

The retail space was donated by Portland businessman Greg Goodman. Another temporary spot he's providing along with a city-owned space will open as two more pop-up stores later this month (I'll let you know when I know more.)
