Welcome and introductions

Migration progress and pilot bureaus

- Information sheet handed out (see attached)
- Migration process is designed to change and adapt as we learn from each bureau
- Seven pilot bureaus identified:
 - Fire has started migration
 - Planning & Sustainability held initial meeting
 - Transportation initial meeting scheduled
 - o Parks
 - Neighborhood Involvement
 - o Environmental Services
 - o Water
- Pilot bureaus will begin the migration process in the coming weeks and into fall
- Pilot bureaus will be working concurrently at various stages in the process
- Role of the pilot bureaus:
 - Manage their site's content; work with their bureau content editors
 - Report and log issues; communicate any concerns
 - Provide process feedback
 - o Determine when site is viewable to the public

Look of the new site

- BTS development team showed the latest version of the new template and included some mock content to show how information could be displayed
- Overall feedback was positive
- A suggestion was made to add icons/pictures with the starter text

Discuss the role of the Steering Committee as we move forward with the migration

- The Steering Committee came together to provide input on the overall approach and look and feel of the site and we now have a basic template
- Moving forward, we anticipate needing guidance and recommendations on the following issues:
 - o Prioritization of changes and additions requested by bureaus
 - Requests to modify the overall template
 - Policy or best practices relating to citywide consistency or main pages
- Group discussed on how to proceed. The group identified the following considerations:
 - Ask current Committee members if they want to continue. May need to address what the commitment would look like before asking the guestion.
 - What is the time commitment moving forward? (unknown: TBD)
 - How many people should be on the committee and what type of representation should that include?

- Group suggested and discussed forming a technical team and a policy team, with the groups frequently communicating and informing each other
- A technical team might include:
 - BTS
 - Public members from the technical community (communications, writers, front-end developers, back-end developers graphic designers, etc.)
 - Bureau reps (with technical knowledge or who can articulate their bureau needs)
 - Ad hoc focus groups if particular issues/questions arise
- A policy team might include:
 - OMF
 - Public members (representing what the community needs to see and how it interfaces with the public)
 - Bureau communications staff (where policy and best practices inform each other)
 - Legal staff
 - BTS as a staff role or liaison from the technical team

Training update

- Training is defined as 1) CMS-specific training, and 2) general training (writing for the web, best practices, social media, etc.)
- Results from survey indicate over 200 content managers and editors are interested in training

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
